I am constantly on the lookout for such a home and know that when the time is right, God will lead us to it. In the meantime, we are getting ready for such a venture. We've gotten the hookups to the city sewer system readied. We have better water pressure. And the next step is to pave the parking lot! But we first have to finish our current God's Plans Our Hands campaign. All financial obligations to it will be over in November of this year. Then we can look forward to having a paved parking lot.



I've drug my feet a little on that as I think the gravel parking lot is part of our charm, but it is slippery for some people to walk on as the gravel shifts. It also puddles when it rains. And mainly, the city requires it paved and if we build, the city inspector will be here checking things out. As a church we certainly want to obey the law and want to keep our members safe from falling. So, to keep the city inspector happy and to be ready for God's Plans to be carried out, that will be our next big project.

In the meantime, we will celebrate our accomplishments, knowing that they aren't really our accomplishments. They were God's Plans and it was only through His blessings that we were able to complete the tasks at hand. Praise God!

## School buildings, cafeteria and art building

For those of you that don't know which building is which. ..the two long buildings that run parallel to Hampton Road are considered the school classrooms (these are the two far west buildings). The cafeteria is the building with the shingled roof that runs parallel to Hill Oak and is the far eastern building. The art building is the one in between that runs east and west.

The property management team considered tearing these building down when Arbor Acres shut its doors last year. An estimate for demolition of all 4 buildings was \$80,000. Was this a wise use of God's property?

During the first Wheatlandette garage sale in the cafeteria, we were approached by the pastors of the Mennonite Church asking if we had any extra rooms for rent. God had a plan. The school classroom buildings were shown to them and they selected the one that leaked the least...the one next to the playground to rent for their church services. It seemed like an ugly building, but the Mennonite Church people had a vision. They went in there and painted all the walls and recarpeted the hallway. They sewed drapes for the windows. It looks great. Unfortunately, the roof still leaks. They have patched the roof with tar and our Property Management Team has patched the roof with tar. But there is only so much tar that can be put on that roof.

Meanwhile the other school classroom building has continued to leak and some of the ceiling has even fallen in. We have had requests from people wanting to start a school there and possibly another church would like to use that building.

And the Mennonite Church is growing and would like to expand their building usage to include the cafeteria. It needs work too, but at least it has a sloped roof!

These are God's buildings and we are charged to take care of them and see that they are used to further God's Kingdom here on earth. The Property Management Team is getting bids to replace the roofs on the two flat roofed buildings. They leak terribly, even the one on the Mennonite Church. But, we don't have the money to fix the roofs. They are praying about it, discussing it, and soon they will have a proposal to bring before the church body.



### CROSSES FOR SALE

The organ that we received from Sun Creek UMC in Allen sounds great and is a good addition to the Wheatland Sanctuary. It is smaller and makes the chancel area feel larger. But still, the old organ is missed. It sounded so beautiful and it looked beautiful! But it no longer worked correctly. The organ is being taken apart and crosses are being made from the wood. There are crosses made from the keys and crosses made from the foot pedals. There are quite large crosses and smaller crosses. The actual cabinet has not been disassembled, perhaps someone can use it as a desk some day. As you remember the wood was beautiful in this organ and the crosses are quite pretty also. These crosses will be for sale on the 31<sup>st</sup> at our GPOH celebration. Prices have not been determined as yet. Plan to purchase a little bit of Wheatland history to grace your home forever.

### Doing His Personal Best



When we profiled Helene Soria and other DMC runners in last month's issue, we didn't know that Jon Piltingsrud (Housekeeping) was fleet of feet back in the '80s, logging seven marathons and numerous other races from 1980 to 1988. Jon has worked for the Dallas Market Center for 23 years, first in landscaping (1986-1991) and since then in Housekeeping. Jon was born in North Dakota, but earned a degree in Forestry from Colorado State University. Although he had an interest in running as a small boy, it wasn't until college when he met other long-distance runners that he really became involved in the sport. He remembers the day right before Thanksgiving in 1975 when his buddy, Val, suggested that they run marathons. "All we knew about marathons is that you run hard for a long period of time," he recalls. His first marathon was the Mile High Marathon in May of 1980. Later that year he ran in the Denver Marathon. In 1981 he fractured a bone in his right foot, but still managed to run the North Dakota half marathon that July. He ran half marathons in 1982, 1983 and 1985. "When I was not able to

run a full marathon, I would find a half marathon to run," he remembers. In 1984 he ran the Rawhide Marathon in Fort Collins. "By the time you finished the marathon, you were in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains," he says. In 1985, Jon ran the 1985 Fiesta Bowl Marathon with his friends Val and Bert. The following year, Jon and Val ran the White Rock Marathon. Jon broke his own record during that race, coming in at 3:29:37. The next year, in 1987, his time for the White Rock Marathon was 3:31:54. In 1988, he stepped up his training, logging 15-25 miles a week, then 30 miles a week, then 40 miles a week for 16 weeks before the marathon. On November 5, 1988 he ran the White Rock half-marathon in 1:27:35. "I was excited and set a goal to run the Turkey Trot at Thanksgiving in less than 52 minutes. I ran it in 51:35." On December 4, 1988, he ran the White Rock Marathon in 3:07:54. "I was able to run all three races impersonal best times. It's any runner's dream and I was able to pull it off," he says. "I started running so that I would have memories," he says. "I had a desire for running, which developed into a passion, which pushed my imagination so that I could live beyond my dreams." In February, Jon started doing 25-minute light workouts twice a day. "You have to have a lot of stamina to work at the Dallas Market Center," he says. "I am amazed at how well my body has responded to the workouts. I know it is because of all that running many years ago."
